What You'll Do

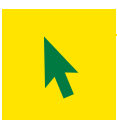
The Director of Collection Strategies leads a team of 10, including 3 directly supervised librarians, and plays a key role in shaping UO Libraries' vision for collections across all formats. This leadership role fosters innovation and collaboration in a supportive environment, with responsibilities that span acquisitions, electronic resource management, assessment, and inclusive workplace practices. As such, you'd be responsible for these key priorities—among other specific duties listed in the position description:

- **Collaboration** with subject specialists and stakeholders to develop holistic collection strategies
- **Management** of acquisitions, electronic resource access, and serials cataloging as well as deselection projects evaluating overlap between print and digital collections
- **Leadership** in consortia collection programs, assessment, and funding allocation
- **Promotion** of innovation, change management, and team development
- **Contribution** to equity and inclusion initiatives across the Libraries
- **Development** of long-range plans for acquisition, exhibition, and collection growth
- **Participation** in professional development and contribution to field-wide trends
- **Service** on the UO Libraries' Leadership Team and help in shaping policy and strategic direction

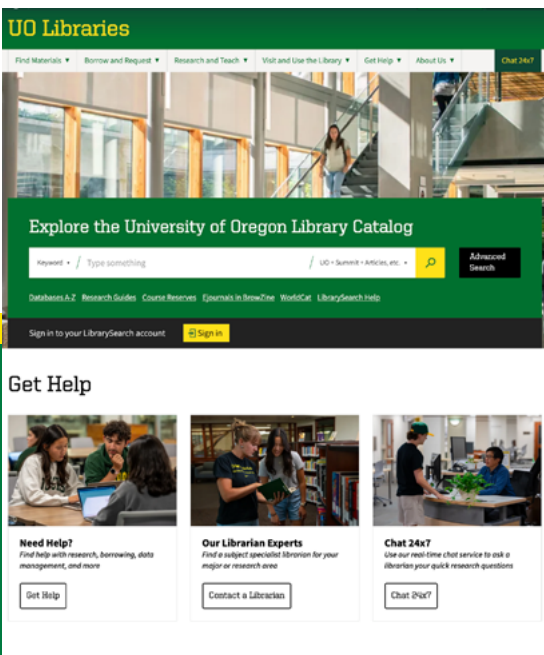
Through strong campus and external partnerships, Collection Strategies drives innovation and contributes to regional, national, and international collection and curation efforts.
