Teaches the theoretical foundation for the study of digital libraries, discussing the technological, organizational, social, and legal issues associated with their development and use. Emphasizes the research and reuse of unique digital collections, with a focus on copyright and licensing, ethical considerations in reusing culturally sensitive materials, and the evaluation of digital library systems. Coaches student groups on how to build a digital library using Omeka. Mentors students seeking careers in digital scholarship librarianship, emphasizing digital humanities and cultural heritage digital libraries.

Teaches issues and trends in planning, developing, and managing digitization projects at libraries, archives, and museums. Instructs students on the applications of the Federal Agencies Digitization Guidelines Initiatives, copyright and licensing considerations, ethics and privacy considerations, and digital technologies that support the digitization and preservation of various materials such as photographs, oral histories, text-based materials, and audio-visual materials. Provides coaching to students on the use of image editing and text editing tools, Fixity, and the development of a digitization project proposal.

With a primary focus on building thematic digital collections as researchers, students gain comprehensive knowledge of digital methodologies, with an emphasis on the technical, legal, ethical, and social aspects involved in working with humanities research data across its curation lifecycle. The curriculum encompasses hands-on activities involving finding, assessing, organizing, and reformatting data, as well as creating and remediating descriptive metadata. Students also gain proficiency in evaluating copyright and licensing considerations, developing data management plans in accordance with National Endowment for the Humanities standards, and sharing thematic research digital collections using GitHub and the open-source platform CollectionBuilder.
